Regeneration of Cherry Orchard Road Neighbourhood Consultation Event – Saturday 17th July 2010 10am – 1pm United Reformed Church, Addiscombe Grove

On behalf of Menta, I would like to invite you to attend a neighbourhood consultation event about the future regeneration of the site known as Cherry Orchard Road (see over).

As you may be aware, Menta first submitted a planning application for this site in November 2008. However, partly as a result of a number of concerns expressed by local residents about the proposals, it was withdrawn in July 2009.

Since then the Council has commissioned the East Croydon Masterplan to see how various proposals for East Croydon could come forward and integrate with much needed station improvement works. Menta has been working with the East Croydon Masterplan team to see how a revised scheme for Cherry Orchard Road can address the emerging Masterplan and previous concerns expressed.

Before submitting a planning application later this year, Menta is undertaking an extensive consultation and engagement programme and would like to start this process with a local neighbourhood consultation event, as the first in a series of opportunities for local people to feed their views into the process of shaping the plans for the site which has the potential deliver new homes, new jobs and new commercial retail and leisure facilities within the context of other emerging regeneration proposals for the area including the East Croydon Masterplan.

The neighbourhood consultation event will be held at the United Reformed Church (EastCroydonURC.org.uk) on Addiscombe Grove, Saturday 17th July, between 10am and 1pm.
